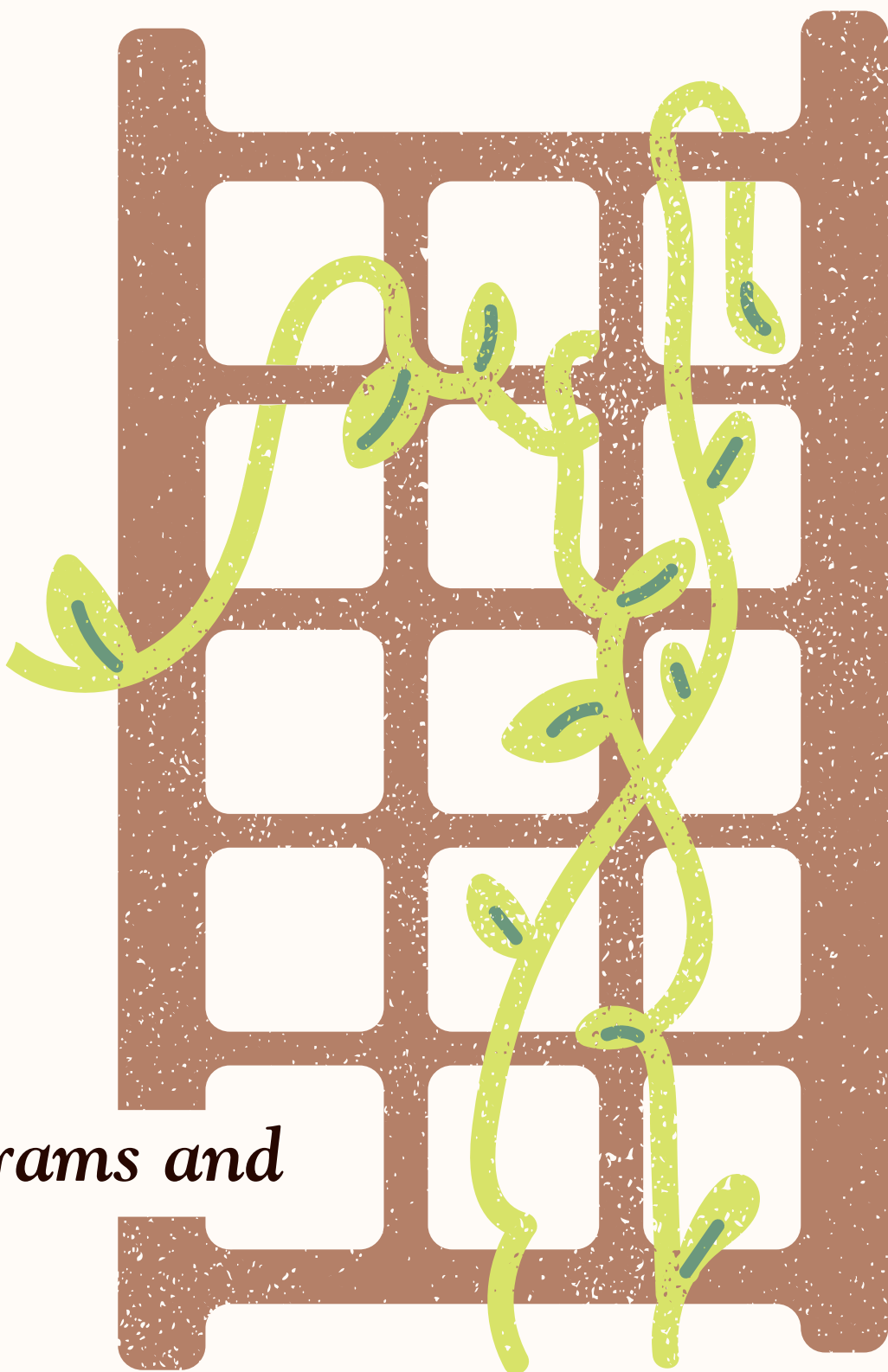

As I look back on this last year of Without Permission's service in our community and in the lives of survivors, I am left in awe. **The work has been meaningful, the survivor testimonies have been impactful.** We've had the privilege of serving Stanislaus, San Joaquin, and

surrounding counties as we lead the community into the battle that will end sex trafficking.

We are at the forefront of preventing this crime from ever happening in the first place. We've partnered with parents, schools, churches, business leaders, law enforcement, social workers, and healthcare staff to educate and inform about the realities of sex trafficking. We set a new Without Permission record for the number of students educated in our schools within a single year and empowered them to prevent themselves from being victimized. **This is the key to lasting change!**

Our Restoration Team has worked tirelessly to walk side by side with survivors on their restoration journey. We have witnessed the devastating effects of trauma and exploitation on their lives, but we have also been humbled and privileged to see monumental steps of **growth, healing, and goal-setting** take place on their road to recovery. Building trust and safety with survivors continues to remain our top priority. The survivors we serve deserve the very best that we have to offer, and while the nature of the work can be heavy and consuming at times, I have never been more proud of our team for the way they show up and pour out.

I'm amazed at how much can be achieved when a **community rallies together for a common goal**. We are seeing a depth of service like never before. Relationships, partnerships, and collaboration all working together in a symphony of hope and healing.

This last year reinforced the generosity found within our community. Prevention

Without Permission has a 3-pillar approach to ending sex trafficking, the first of which is Prevention. Our heart is to prevent this crime from happening in the first place. Educating our youth and community is paramount to accomplishing this goal.

More people than ever before are being educated and empowered to prevent themselves and their loved ones from becoming victimized.

We continue to cultivate our Prevention Programming by investing in campus education and parent resourcing. Our new *Family Safety Guide* equips parents with knowledge about online & video game safety, social media grooming tactics, and how to begin these difficult conversations right at home. Looking ahead, our team is actively creating age-appropriate resources to put directly into the hands of students.

Campus Education

Our #NotAPriceTag presentation educates students on **trafficking tactics, identifying safe adults, internet & gaming safety, and more**. This past school year, **over 10,000 students across 45 campuses** received this training. *That's equivalent to 208 school buses full of students!* This kind of awareness helps prevent students from becoming exploited in the first place. This year's focus was empowering students to **know they have a voice** and to use it if they need help. As a result, more students felt safe disclosing their own experiences and seeking support. These prevention efforts disrupt the cycle of victimization and keep our communities safer!

Lina's Story

When Lina* was just 18, she met a boy at a party. He gave her attention, lavish gifts, and made her feel special. Very quickly, he began asking for small favors and planting seeds of distrust in her family and friends, all

while pretending to be the perfect boyfriend. He continued to isolate, manipulate, and push Lina's boundaries, and **by the time she realized what was happening, she was trapped** by this “boyfriend pimp.” He sold her body to strangers, physically and sexually abusing her for two long years.

Determined to escape that life, Lina eventually sought help. Without Permission Navigators met her a year ago at the start of her journey toward freedom and healing. We worked with her to develop goals and arranged for her to receive professional counseling. We modeled trust, consistency, and reliability in healthy relationships by **showing up** when we said we would and answering her calls in crisis when no one else did. We provided transportation for her to enroll in college and attend counseling appointments; we supported her through obtaining and succeeding at her first job interview. Lina has grown immensely in the past year and is now unstoppable! She is accomplishing her goals and has a vision for her life!

Because of the faithful support of our community of donors, volunteers, and partners, WP Navigators were able to see Lina through these incredibly hard first steps of rebuilding body, spirit and mind after the trauma of trafficking. This community and its outpouring of generosity and love destroy the lie so many survivors believe: that no one cares for them, they are all alone, and that their lives don't matter.

Justice matters – it is the second pillar in our approach to ending sex trafficking. Partnering with Law Enforcement and local justice officials is crucial to our ability to serve survivors.



Our Jail Diversion Program has seen steady growth. Those caught up in the cycle of prostitution and exploitation are now being diverted to a program creating meaningful change in their lives. Deeper partnerships and stronger relationships have resulted in a safer community.

We had the privilege to partner with the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Human Trafficking Task Force during a statewide operation.

Restoration

Restoration is the final pillar in our approach to ending sex trafficking. This includes walking with survivors one-on-one throughout their healing journey, focusing on the whole person and six key cornerstones: shelter, criminal justice, education, health, personal care, and faith.

This year's focus has been on strengthening our relationships in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties within Probation, County Services/Child Welfare, the Family Justice Centers, and other community agencies. These partnerships help to reach victims from all over the Central Valley through individual services, group classes, professional counseling, transportation, housing, and employment assistance.

In the comfort and safety of our warm family environment at Just His House, we celebrate birthdays, graduations & holidays with survivors. We provide weekly trauma-informed classes. Some days survivors simply have fun while learning to cook. We "do life" together.

Healing & Restoring

We go on monthly outings with the survivors that attend programs at our day facility. Over the last year, we have had the chance to engage in several activities in the community, including candle making, pottery, going to the lake, bowling, ice skating, and more.

These outings are designed to support healing. For many survivors, childhood involved trauma, fear, and instability. The outings give them a chance to reclaim a bit of the childhood they have lost, while modeling healthy, family-friendly recreation. They allow survivors to practice engaging in the community in a safe and meaningful way. We see the outings as a part of the healing journey, *reminding survivors that they deserve joy, belonging, and a chance to build happy memories.*

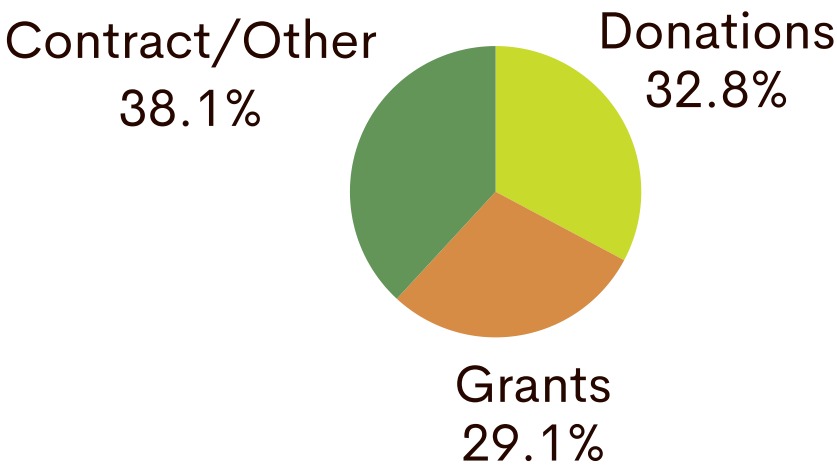

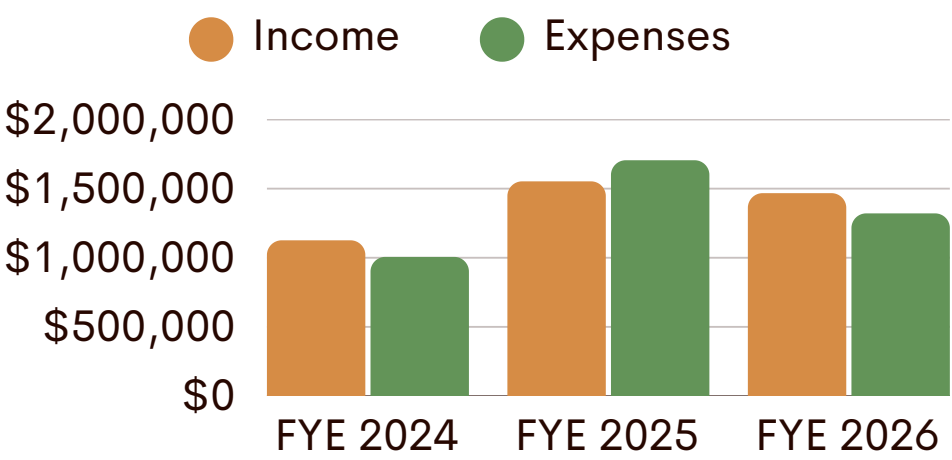

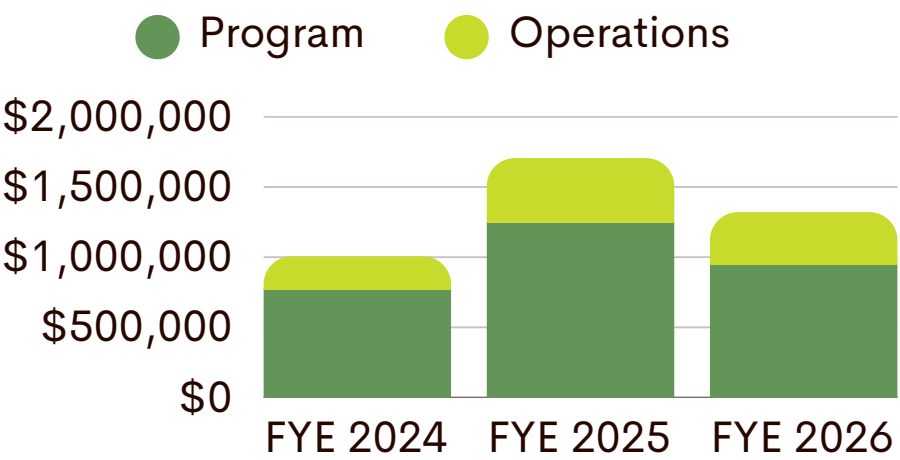
FY 25-26 Revenue Sources

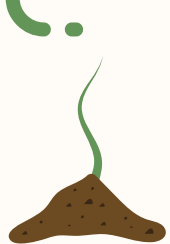
